This fee covers annual application and inspection report review, and one annual on site inspection. Additional inspections required for applicants engaged in parallel production (*Section D. Producer Additional Requirements*), or required to determine compliance (WAC 16-157-250,) will be billed at a rate of \$40 per hour.

*If you withdraw your application to the International Organic Program prior to your inspection, \$100 of your Application Fee is not refundable.
